As I reflect on the past year, I am filled with pride, gratitude, and deep appreciation for what we have accomplished together. In 2025, the OCH Foundation reached over 9,500 tenants through programs and initiatives designed to remove barriers, empower, strengthen well-being, and create pathways to opportunity. Behind that number are real people, real stories, and meaningful moments of connection and support.

This was truly a record-breaking year for our Foundation. Our programs reached new heights. Our Inspired-by-Learning Bursary awarded 36 bursaries, the highest number in its history, helping tenants pursue post-secondary education. Through Pack-a-Sack, we distributed 2,111 backpacks, ensuring children and youth across OCH communities had the school supplies they needed to start the year with confidence and dignity.

We also saw extraordinary generosity from our supporters. Both our Annual Giving Campaign and Golf Tournament raised more than ever before, a powerful reflection of the trust our community places in our work and the belief that everyone deserves the opportunity to thrive.

As we look ahead to 2026, we are energized and ready. We are preparing to launch Build Your Path, our newest program focused on helping tenants pursue careers in the skilled trades. Our team is growing, our partnerships are deepening, and we are sharpening our focus to meet rising tenant needs.

The challenges facing our communities are real, but so is our determination to meet this moment with empathy, innovation, and care.

As we look back on an incredible year, we do so with immense gratitude. Thank you for standing by us and for believing in the power of community.



Pack-a-Sack

For families living in OCH communities, back-to-school costs can be a heavy burden. With school supplies easily exceeding \$100 per child, back-to-school expenses can quickly add up, placing families under further financial strain. Pack-a-Sack program provides children and youth with backpacks filled with essential school supplies, helping them start the year prepared and confident.

This milestone was made possible by the second annual **24-hour Pack-a-Thon**, where volunteers came together to assemble and distribute backpacks directly to communities. Thanks to this collaboration, young people started the school year with not just supplies, but the tools to thrive.

EV Carshare

In 2025, we launched an Electric Vehicle (EV) Carshare Program, expanding access to affordable and sustainable transportation for tenants living in OCH's Mikinàk community. Supported by a \$250,000 donation from the RBC Foundation and delivered in partnership with OCH, Communauto and EnviroCentre, the EV Carshare program gives residents access to EVs, without the costs and responsibilities of car ownership.

Summer Food Drive

Over the summer, families living in OCH communities received vital support through a city-wide effort to address child hunger. The Ottawa Summer Food Drive, coordinated by Khalsa Aid and led by students from 16 Ottawa-Carleton District School Board schools, collected more than 90,000 pounds of food. More than 30,000 pounds of this food was directed to the OCH Foundation.

Volunteers from Lionhearts worked with our team to deliver food directly to nine OCH communities, prioritizing neighbourhoods where need was greatest. The donations provided the equivalent of 12,000 meals, helping families bridge the gap when schools are closed and access to daily meals is reduced. This initiative was made possible through the collaboration of community partners including Khalsa Aid, the Ottawa-Carleton District School Board, Italfoods Ottawa, Lionhearts, and the Ottawa Food Bank.

EnviroCentre


